Through His Passion, Death and Resurrection, an unfathomable ocean of mercy was made available for all of us. Praying "The Divine Mercy Chaplet" at three o'clock glorifies and asks for His mercy. God loves us no matter what. He wants us to realize that His mercy is greater than our sins, if we only ask for His forgiveness and compassion. He wants to grant us all the graces we need if we only receive it and allow it to flow to others. In praying and glorifying God, we plead and beg for His blessings of mercy to the whole world. We ask with complete trust and our Lord fills us with graces we needed to become merciful as the Heavenly Father is merciful.

To practice mercy towards others, we are called to an altruistic love with action in many various ways. In the spirit of love of neighbor, we are called to perform the Corporal Works of Mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, comfort the imprisoned, visit the

sick and bury the dead. More so, in doing the Spiritual Works of Mercy, we are exhorted to admonish sinners, instruct the uninformed, counsel the doubtful, comfort the sorrowful, be patient with those in error, forgive offenses and pray for the living and the dead. By practicing these acts of mercy, we respond to the physical, mental, spiritual and emotional needs of others. **As we serve others, we actually serve the merciful Savior Himself.** "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brethren of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40). The Lord's compassion flowed through us as we recognize and serve those in need of His mercy and love.

In His great love for all, He gave us the gift of Himself in the Holy Eucharist, the "Bread of Life"---really, truly and substantially Present, His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity as food to nourish us on our journey of faith here in this land of exile, a living promise to sustain us before we reach the heavenly Jerusalem. His Real Presence in the Sacrament of Love as we adore Him delightfully on the altar keep us hopeful for the life to come. The glorious miracle of His Presence in the Blessed Sacrament brings us everlasting joy amidst the pains and adversities of life strengthening us to persevere to the end. The Lord said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:53-54).

As a community devoted to evangelizing the healing love of Christ in the Holy Eucharist and promoting Eucharistic Adoration, Eucharistic celebrations and a Catholicism group study about the truths of our faith, may God in His love and mercy bless all of us as we strive to praise, honor and glorify Him as well as perform our duties to our brethren in need. # SEE, I WILL SAVE MY PEOPLE

*From the dogmatic constitution on the Church of the Second Vatican Council*

In his wisdom and goodness the eternal Father created the whole world according to his supremely free and mysterious purpose and decreed that men should be raised up to share in the divine life. When they fell in Adam, he did not abandon them but always kept providing them with aids to salvation, in consideration of Christ, who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. Before the ages the Father already knew all the elect and predestined them to be made into the likeness of his Son, so that he should be the firstborn among many brothers.

God resolved to gather into holy Church all who believe in Christ. The Church, foreshadowed even from the beginning of the world, so marvelously prepared in the history of the people of Israel, established in these last times and revealed by the outpouring of the Holy spirit, will be made perfect in glory at the end of time. Then, as we read in the Fathers of the Church, all the righteous from Adam onward – from Abel, the righteous, to the last of the elect – will be gathered in the universal Church in the presence of the Father.

Finally, those who have not yet received the Gospel are in their different ways related to God's people.

In the first place, there is that people which was given the covenants and the promises and from which Christ was born by human descent: the people which is by God's choice most dear on account of the patriarchs. God never repents of his gifts or his call.

God's plan of salvation embraces those also who acknowledge the Creator. Among these are especially the Mohammedans; they profess

their faith as the faith of Abraham, and with us they worship the one, merciful God who will judge men on the last day.

God himself is not far from those others who seek the unknown God in darkness and shadows, for it is he who gives to all men life and inspiration and all things, and who as Savior desires all men to be saved.

Eternal salvation is open to those who, through no fault of their own, do not know Christ and his Church but seek God with a sincere heart, and under the inspiration of grace try in their lives to do his will, made known to them by the dictates of their conscience. Nor does Divine Providence deny the aids necessary for salvation to those who, without blame on their part, have not yet reached an explicit belief in God, but strive to lead a good life, under the influence of God's grace.

Whatever goodness and truth is found among them is seen by the Church as a preparation for the Gospel, and as given by him who shines on all men, so that they may at last have life.
